The Names of God

To better understand the character and nature of God, it is helpful to study the names by which God revealed Himself to Israel in the Old Testament. In our culture, names do not necessarily reveal anything about a person. But this was not so in the culture of the Old Testament times. The name a person was given told something of his nature or character. It was not uncommon for a person's name to be changed: Abram to Abraham, Jacob to Israel, Saul to Paul, Simon to Peter, etc. Therefore, as we study the names by which God revealed Himself, we learn something of His very nature. Let us look at some of these revealing names.
